External Observation Versus Introspection in Shaping Mental Field References;

i.e., external surface operations to search for Introspective Imagination and Conceptualization capability, would likely decrease relevant Internal Introspective functions, such as an internally driven Metacognition and Formal Operation.

- A brief description of Pavlov's Classical Conditioning:
UCS \rightarrow UCR (No conditioning to yield a response),
NS \rightarrow UCS (Neutral Stimulus repeatedly paired with
an Unconditioned Stimulus becomes a conditioned
stimulus which yields a conditioned response;
CS \rightarrow CR (Conditioned Stimulus yields a Conditioned
Response).

- A brief description of Skinner's Operant Conditioning: Behaviors are shaped to modify behaviors with Positive and Negative Rewards and Punishments (Positive implies applied and negative implies removal), successive approximation (gradual shaping of incremental behaviors towards a specific outcome), as well as Fixed and Variable Interval and Ratio Scales of Reinforcement (Interval implies clock time and Ratio, number of times a behavior is expected to occur before being rewarded).


